

AMENDMENTS 2007

Rule 55

(b) Youth any age MAY NOT exhibit **Colt/Stallions** in Youth or Non Youth events.

Rule 59 CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY

(h) Self advertising on horse or rider equipment is prohibited in the arena.

Rule 89 Dressage

Unofficial Dressage including Western Dressage

(i) Tack, Equipment & Attire shall be the same as in English & Western classes respectively.

Rule 98 (ix)(a)

TEXAS Style split reins must be held in one hand with one finger between the reins.

Rule 106 Trail Class

0-Score – Third Refusal applies to throughout the course not at each obstacle.

Rule 107

NRHA Reining Pattern No 11 to replace pattern 11 in the rule book and to be used for Beginner classes only. Patterns 12 & 13 to remain, Patterns 14 and 15 to be deleted.

Rule 109 Led Trail

Scoring – from zero to ten per obstacle

Handlers shall be penalized up to three (3) points for every time, obviously cuing their horses that is:

- (a) Physically pushing horse in any direction
- (b) Stepping on or in an obstacle with the horse, (i.e. walk on the bridge or step into the poles).
exception walk into a square or by direction of the judge.
- (c) Holding the horse by the halter other than the lead.

5 point Penalty - Blatant disobedience (kicking out, bucking, rearing, striking)

Disqualifications

- (a) Hitting the horse with the lead-line or other object
- (b) Lameness
- (c) Fall of horse
- (d) Improper equipment
- (e) Any obvious intimidation resulting in distress to the horse
- (f) Exhibitor disrespectful to judge.

Rule 109 (B) Hunter in Hand

Class Routine: Horses will be judged individually on the triangle. All horses must enter and remain in the arena; extra handlers must be correctly attired, and may only hold one horse. The horses will approach the judging area and set up for inspection (i.e. with all four legs of the horse visible by the judge standing on either side of the horse). At the Judges request, the horse will then walk a small triangle ABCA. The horse will continue on at a trot following the large ADEA. At the completion of judging, the handler will return to the line up. As one horse leaves the next one will enter the judging area promptly. When all horses in the class have completed the triangle, they will be presented in the line up for placing. Scoring system; 60% movement (walk and Trot), 30% Conformation, 10% temperament. Any ties can be split on conformation. An Exhibitor may show more than one horse in a class on the triangle.
